A Pragmatic Analysis on News Reports

ABSTRACT

This study was done based on the news reports on one incident published in the Sri Lankan national

newspapers. Accordingly, it was observed that the news reports are prepared by observing one

incident in different perspectives in various newspapers. The aim of this study is to investigate

how language has been used to present one's opinions and concepts in those news reports, on that

respective incident. The Critical Discourse Analysis of Fairclough (1995) was utilized in this

study. By analyzing the language used in reporting incidents by different reporters, the special

features of language such as the lexicon, grammatical patterns, terms and sentence patterns were

identified. Additionally, the utilization of such language features to present their opinions and

concepts were observed. The study was based on the news reports on the unrest which occurred in

the Aluthgama, Beruwala in the Kalutara districts on the 15th of June 2015, which appeared in the

national newspapers of Sri Lanka, the Lakbima, Divaina, Dinamina, Rivira and Maubima. It is

seen that these newspapers have observed the said incident in different angles. It was further

revealed that the reporting has been done by different newspapers, while utilizing language in

order to express the concepts and opinions in an effective manner.
