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Management of *Mukhadūshika* (Acne vulgaris) with *Jalaukāvacharana* (Leech Therapy): A Case Study

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Jalaukāvacharana (Leech Therapy) is one among the Raktamokshana which is indicated in many kinds of skin manifestations. Similarly, Mukhadūshika (Ace vulgaris) is a common skin disease in adolescents encountered by general practitioners and dermatologists in day today clinical practices. Current treatment procedures which include surgery, laser treatment, oral antibiotics and topical applications are associated with many side effects, bacterial resistance, and irritation of the skin, peeling, scar and recurrence. But in Ayurveda, the treatment procedures like vamana, lēpa, nasya and Raktamokshana are explained. Among these, Raktamokshana using jalauka provides a simple, painless, cost-effective treatment for Mukhadūshika. A 20 years old female patient presented in Shalya Clinic in Gampaha Wickramarachchi Ayurveda Institute, University of Kelaniya, Yakkala with the complain of pimples on both cheeks associated with itching, burning sensation for 2 years. Patient was subjected to Jalaukāvacharana on both sides of cheeks of the face due to bilateral distribution of *pidakās. Jalaukāvacharana* was done on Day 1, Day 5, and Day 10. Before & after treatment assessment was recorded. Patient was followed up for 60 days. This case presented with vēdana, pāka and shopha, along with dāha (burning sensation) and kandu (localized itching). Three sittings of Jalaukāvacharana were done (on Day 1, Day 5, and Day 10). Here, *jalaukā* sucks the vitiated blood, does the *sthānika shādhana*. Avurveda Raktamākshana using *jalaukā* provides a simple, painless, cost effective treatment for this common ailment with no short term side effects.
