Abstract

This research is based on the study of assistance of the micro finance institutions for the financial difficulties of the rural people. Monitory inconvenient is the most crucial matter for the success of the rural areas people. Most of the cases formal financial institutions are not considered about those types of people due to mismatch with their requirements.
